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LESSON 5.4 - Branching Quiz Questions ?

Preview Edit Reports Grade Essays

After you've created the "beginning" question for your branching, click **DONE**. You will need to return to this question later to edit it and assign your page movements, but first you need to create the pages the test-takers will be directed to when they choose a certain answer from the multiple choice. In the example image on the previous page, there were **FOUR** possible answers students could select. You also need to create an **END OF BRANCHING** page where the **SUBMIT** button will appear, so I created five new pages using the *page break* option.

To add a page break like the example shown in the first image below, Click on the **ADD ITEM** button and scroll to the bottom of the drop-down menu. You will see *page break* at the very bottom of the menu. Select it.

A box will open. You have the option of entering a page title (name) or not. It can be a bit confusing when branching questions if you do not name it, because you will need to know which page break name, for example *Dogs*, needs to be moved above the related questions

(the questions about dogs). If you don't name the page break or if you simply assign a page number as the title, you may forget which page break header goes above the specific group of questions.

You can also enter a description. This is good if you need to provide directions SPECIFIC to the questions under the page break header. Click DONE when you are finished.
